3 Die in Head-on Crash

Three people were killed yesterday in southern Chesterfield County when a car drifted across the center line of Harrowgate Road and slammed head-on into an oncoming car.

The dead included a highly regarded Chesterfield County volunteer, Oliver Graves, 75, and his wife, Dorothy Graves, 78. They were in the car that was struck. The driver of the car that crossed into their path was Alice H. Peterson, 82, of Colonial Heights. All three died on impact.

A Chesterfield police official at the scene said Graves was a longtime volunteer and former county employee who served as "an ambassador of goodwill for Chesterfield County."

Graves had worked as a volunteer firefighter, auxiliary police officer and deputy sheriff assigned to courtroom security. He also had served as sergeant-at-arms at Chesterfield Board of Supervisors meetings.

In April 1987, the supervisors recognized him for his "outstanding public service and citizenship."

... News of Oliver Graves' death spread quickly in Chesterfield government circles, and those who knew him spoke highly of him.

... Graves was a deacon at the Second Branch Baptist Church, where he distributed

MISCELLANEOUS GRAVES FAMILIES

DESCENDANTS OF JOHN GREAVES OF ST. MARY'S CO., MD

GENERATION 1

John Greaves (1) died in 1748 in St. Clements, St. Mary's Co., MD. It is not known when and where he was born, or who he married. He belonged to the Protestant Episcopal Church. In his will he mentioned he had a right to an estate in England. If recovered, the estate was to be divided equally between his 2 sons and 4 daughters (then living), each paying their equal part of the charges that shall occur in recovering the estate. John owned land on either side of St. Clements Bay, which is around Chaptico and Leonardtown, MD.

It is not presently known when John Greaves arrived in America, nor where he came from. 1719 was the first time John applied for land certificates and had the land surveyed. He may have been in St. Mary's Co. for several years before that time. Also, there is evidence that John did not name the land he owned, but that it was named by a previous owner.

It appears that John Greaves was probably descended from William Greaves of Greenhill,

parish of Norton, near Sheffield, South Yorkshire, England. This family lived generally south and west of Sheffield. Greenhill is only about 10 miles north of Beeley, and it is possible that William Greaves was descended from the Greaves family of Beeley (genealogy 228). William Greaves had a son, John Greaves, who was executor of his father's will. William also had a daughter, Catherine Greaves, who married Hugh Benson of St. Clement's Bay, St. Mary's Co., MD. It is possible that John Greaves of MD was William's son, John, but more likely (based on estimated birth dates of 1680-1690 for John and 1600 for William) he was a grandson. The mention in the will of John of MD of a right to an estate in England probably referred to the estate of William Greaves.

John Baptist Graves (10) was born about 1732 in St. Clements, St. Mary's Co., MD. He married Susanna ----- about 1758 in MD. He died in 1800 in St. Clements, MD, between the date of his will, 2 Dec. 1799, and the proving of the will, 8 Aug. 1800. She died in 1806 in St. Clements, St. Mary's Co., MD, between the date of her will, 12 April 1801, and the proving of the will, 1 April 1806. They were both buried in St. Clements, MD. They belonged to the Protestant Episcopal Church. All their children were born in St. Clements, MD.

Mrs. Anne Black, 507 West 19th St., El Dorado, AR 71730 (abblack@gulftel.com), knew that she was descended from SARAH GRAVES and John Miles of KY. Recently she determined that the parents of Sarah were Jesse Graves and Martha A. -----, and the parents of Jesse were an unknown Graves and Catherine -----.

(ED. NOTE: This is the family of John Graves and Sarah Catherine Noble of MD & KY. The descent is shown below. Any additional information would be helpful, especially for the ancestry of John Graves, the earliest known ancestor, and for the descendants of all the children of Jesse A. Graves, #12 in generation 3.

It is likely that John Graves was descended from John Greaves of St. Mary's Co., MD (genealogy 247) in the preceding query, but the connection is not known.)

DESCENDANTS OF JOHN GRAVES AND SARAH NOBLE OF MD & KY

GENERATION 1

John Graves (1) was born in St. Mary's Co., MD, and was buried at Thomas Meeting House (Methodist). He married Sarah Noble (also spelled Nobile) in 1783 in St. Mary's Co., although a marriage record has not been found. She was born in St. Mary's Co., MD, and was buried at St. Charles Church Cem., St. Mary, Washington Co. (in what is now Marion Co.), KY. At least their first 5 children were born in St. Mary's Co., MD.

John was a non-Catholic, but didn't mind that Sarah raised the children as Catholics, as she was "a very pious lady."

GENERATION 4

John Truman Graves (39) was born about 1763 and died in 1815, both in St. Clements, St. Mary's Co., MD. He was buried in a private cemetery in "Nelsons Adventure". He married Ann Edley, daughter of John Edley and Mary Attaway, on 3 Feb. 1798 in St. Mary's Co., MD. She was born in St. Mary's Co., MD, died in St. Clements, MD, and was buried in St. Mary's Co. He was Protestant Episcopal and was a member of the All Faith P.E. Church until his death. His wife, Ann, had always been a Roman Catholic and, with his consent, she raised the children as Catholics. They all married Catholics.

They moved to KY before 1800, and settled on land later (in 1897) owned by Joseph Hagan in Marion Co., KY, when "it was a trackless wilderness." John was an energetic, useful and law-abiding citizen. (Much of this information is from John Mattingly's "Biographies", at the Filson Club, Louisville, KY.)

According to *Catholic Families of Southern Maryland*, Records of Catholic Residents of St. Mary's Co. in the Eighteenth Century, compiled by Timothy J. O'Rourke, 1985, adult white males were required to take an Oath of Allegiance to the revolutionary government of Maryland, according to a law passed by the General Assembly in the February Session, 1777. Among those taking the oath in 1778 (all administered by Justice John Ireland): Jeremiah Graves, John Graves, and John B. Greaves.

According to *Muster Rolls and Other Records of Service of Maryland Troops in the American Revolution, 1775-1783*, Baltimore, 1900, John Graves was a member of the St. Mary's County company of Capt. Uriah Forrest, part of Col. Thomas Ewing's Battalion for the Flying Camp, mustered 28 July 1776. It is believed that this John Graves and the one who took the Oath of Allegiance are the one who married Sarah Catherine Noble, but there is no proof.

Graves (2) may have first married Maria Mattingly, and he was probably the George Graves who married Catherine Medley, daughter of John Medly (or Medley?), on 10 (or 12) Feb. 1810 in Washington Co., KY. Catherine was born in 1793 in MD, and died in 1865. She secondly married Ralph Leak, her brother-in-law and the father of a Dr. Leak who married a Miss Rhodes and lived at New Haven, KY.

Ms. Pat Patterson, 105 East 15 St., New York City, NY 10003-2135 (patpny@att.net), is trying to find the ancestry of her CASSANDRA GRAVES, given as #2 in the following genealogy. Ms. Joanne Lincoln (linc@idd.net), is not a Graves descendant but is descended from HULDA BULLOCK, daughter of John and Lucinda Bullock, found in the same household as Cassandra Graves in the 1850 census. It seems likely that Lucinda was married to a Graves man who died and then she remarried to John Bullock. Can anyone help?

DESCENDANTS OF PARENTS OF

GENERATION 1

----- Graves (1) probably died before 1850. He probably married Lucinda -----. The 1850 census for Shannon Co., MO lists: John Bullock, b.c. 1812, MD, Lucinda Bullock, b.c. 1813, KY, William Graves, age 12, b. IL, Cassian Graves, age 14, b. IL, Hulda Bullock, age 5, b. IL, Edmund Bullock, age 2, b. MO. The 1860 census lists Lucinda Bullock without John, and lists children Hulda, age 15, Edmond, age 12, Sarah, age 11, and John, age 3. The 1870 census did not list Lucinda, but did list William Graves, age 32, b. IL, Margaret, age 26, b. IN, Amanda, age 9, b. MO, Louisa, age 3, b. MO, John Bullock, age 13, b. MO. It appears that Lucinda first married a Graves man, he probably died, and then she married John Bullock about 1840-1844. John Bullock probably died in the 1850's and Lucinda died in the 1860's.

Mary Delilah George (4) was born 24 April 1856 in Ink, Shannon Co., MO, and died 20 Oct. 1938 in Eminence, Shannon Co., MO. Col. John Graves (750) was born 18 Dec. 1757 in Louisa Co., Va., and died 31 (or 10) Oct. 1843 in Fayette Co., Ky. He married Lydia Graves (#729), daughter of Thomas Graves and Isabella Bartlett (his uncle and aunt), on 23 Dec. 1784 in Louisa Co., Va. She was born 2 Oct. 1769 and died 7 Sept. 1856.

The consent of her father to the marriage is filed with the marriage bonds of the county. The pension record of John Graves shows that he was born in Louisa Co. Dec. 18, 1757, that he resided for a while in Spotsylvania Co. and later in Orange Co., VA, enlisting in Spotsylvania Co. in 1776. After his death, on April 8, 1844, his son John applied for his pension to be continued to Lydia, the widow. Lydia made oath that she was 74 years old on Oct. 2, 1843, and had married John Graves on Dec. 23, 1784, thus proving that she was the daughter of Thomas Graves and Isabella Bartlett.

John Graves (1) was born about 1799 and died about 1862. He probably married Amy Tucker, daughter of Nathaniel Tucker and Martha Lawrence. She was born about 1807. Another source believes John married Amy or Anny Spencer. The 1850 census lists John, 51; Annie, 43; Willis, 27; Sarah, 25; Jane, 22; Polly, 19; Richard, 16; Lucy, 12; Hannah, 9; Martha, 6; Calvin, 5; John C., 2 mo. The 1870 census lists Anna Graves, 65, and Caroline Graves, 21. They were family 92, family 88 was her sister Jane Luther as head of household, family 93 was her brother Calvin Graves and his family, and family 94 was her brother Willis Graves.

Based on old correspondence, the Graves family apparently lived in Randolph Co., N.C., near Montgomery, in the Pisgah area.

John's will did not list Pauline and Hannah among his children, so it is possible they were not his children or died before 1862. His son, John, probably died young, since the will refers to Calvin as his youngest son.

The 1850 census for Chesterfield Co., SC (film 0444814, dwelling/family 110/110, p. 106, Chesterfield Dist.) lists the following family:

It is likely that this Sarah J. Graves was Sarah Jane Graves who married William A. Purvis. It is also possible that David W. This family is on page 82, *Graves Families of the World*. In addition, it seems very likely that the husband of Mary Graves

was a grandson of Robert Graves of Anson Co., NC and Chesterfield Co., SC (see book of that same name by Kenneth Vance Graves, 1980), descended from Capt. Thomas Graves of VA. (A check of the Graves families in Chesterfield Co., SC and Anson Co., NC in 1830 and 1840 could probably find the name of Mary's husband. Then a thorough search of wills, deeds, and other documents in these counties might provide the additional information needed for a connection.)

Clarinda ("Clara" or "Clary") Graves (7) was born 23 Oct. 1859 and died in 1933. She lived all her life in Cheraw, Chesterfield Co., SC. She married Christopher Wesley Teal, son of Benjamin Teal and Eliza (or Elizabeth) Davis, on 25 Nov. 1878. He was born 1854-1857, probably 1855. All their children were born in Chesterfield Co., SC.

It is remembered by the descendants that Clarinda was an orphan and was raised in her teen years by a Lasiter (or Lassiter) woman, who was a widow of a Civil War soldier, buried in Lynchburg or Gettysburg. Ms. Lonette Bowers, 6912 NE Sandy Blvd., Portland, OR 97218 (lonetteb@msn.com), is descended from SARAH ("SALLY") GRAVES born about 1740 who married William Gregory. She would like to learn more about her part of the family and find the ancestry of Sarah Graves. Information from the genealogy for Sarah Graves (gen. 288) is in the next paragraph.

Sarah ("Sally") Graves (1) was probably born about 1740-45 in VA, possibly Caroline Co., VA, based on the birthdates of her husband and of her children. She died about 1783 in Washington Co., TN.

It was previously believed that Sally might be a daughter of Beverly Graves, partly because of the name Beverly being used for a son and a couple of grandchildren. However, since Beverly Graves was probably born about 1750, it seems very unlikely that Sally was his daughter. She may have been his sister, and their father may have been John Graves.

She married William Gregory, son of Philemon (or William) Gregory, about 1760. He was born about 1736 in VA, and died in 1806 in NC. There was a William Gregory who was bound to Thomas Dillard, Jr. in Dec. 1759 in Antrim Parish, Halifax Co., VA. However, that was probably another person, since the person bound to Thomas Dillard in 1759 was almost certainly a minor, and also William Gregory married the next year in 1760.

On the other hand, the William Gregory who married Sally Graves was certainly connected with the Thomas Dillard family, and, based on the birthdates of the children, William could have been born later.

After Sally died, William Gregory married Fanny or Elizabeth, probably about 1785.

It is believed that Sally and William lived in Pittsylvania Co., VA.

William may have moved west to Montgomery Co., VA (to a section later to be cut off into Wythe Co.) by 1782, for, according to genealogist Worth Ray, it was in Oct. or Nov. of that year that he moved from there to the Watauga country (in what is today Unicoi Co., TN) with a group of settlers which included Capt. Thomas Dillard and the Love brothers, Robert and Thomas. The three families were to become further connected by considerable intermarriage.

In 1786, William received a land grant (no. 712) of 96 ares at the rate of 50 shillings per acre in what was then Washington Co., NC. (The area went through several civil jurisdictions before evolving into the present Unicoi Co. The records of William's era are housed in Washington Co., TN.) His name appears on various county records from 1782 to 1789.

Members of the three families moved again in 1790 to Burke Co., NC, where William was listed next to John Dillard in the 1790 census of Morgan District with 4 males under 16, 3 males over 16, and 3 females.

On 4 Aug. 1798, William (of Buncombe Co., NC, which was formed from Burke in 1791) sold to John Acton the plantation where he formerly lived in the Greasy Cove area of Washington Co., TN, near the present town of Erwin. Beverly Gregory was a testator.

According to one source (R-4), Sally did not die until the early 1800's. However, it is believed that the 1783 death date is correct, and that two and possibly three children of William were by his second marriage. Marc Watts (address unknown) believes that the parents of Sarah are Thomas Graves and Elizabeth Moody. Thomas was a son of Francis Graves and grandson of Capt. Thomas Graves of VA. The paragraph from the Capt. Thomas Graves genealogy is below.

Thomas Graves (35) was born about 1684-5, and died about 1742-3. He married Elizabeth Moody, daughter of John Moody and Mary -----, about 1708-10. She was born about 1690 and died about 1739.

From the will of Thomas' brother Richard, we know that Thomas had sons Richard and Francis. There seem to be no documents in Essex Co. that prove other children, but from the fact that John Graves qualifies as administrator we consider him the oldest son. He was not a son of either Francis or Richard, as their wills show, and his birth is too early for him to have been a grandson. By elimination, therefore, he was a son of Thomas.

CAPT. THOMAS GRAVES OF VA

Mrs. Leslie Slater Hill, 1009 Old Lytton Springs Rd., Lockhart, TX 78644 (LHill42731@aol.com), is descended from Capt. THOMAS GRAVES of VA via Thomas⁵ Graves m. Ann Davenport, Robert⁶ Graves,

Lewis⁷ Graves, Davenport⁸ Graves. She is #850 on p. 124 of the Robert Graves book published by Kenneth Vance Graves in 1980.

She would like to find documentation for the children of Lewis⁷ Graves. They are listed in DAR applications and elsewhere as Penelope, Malinda, Davenport, Jane, Betsy, John C., Maria Pamela, Basil (or Bazil or Baswell), and William U. (or W.). Also, we have information on descendants of Davenport, Jane, and Pamela, but not of the other children. Help is needed.

She said there are supposedly loose papers relating to the estate of Lewis Graves in Jasper Co., GA, not Newton Co., GA where he supposedly died. She has sent for copies of these.

Lewis Graves was born in Spotsylvania Co., VA, lived in Chesterfield Co., SC and Anson Co., NC, then in Wilkes Co. and Washington Co. (later Hancock Co.), GA, then in Jasper Co. and finally in Newton Co., GA. His son, Davenport Graves, was born in NC, probably Anson Co., married Nancy McElroy in 1813 in Jasper Co., GA, moved to Dallas Co., AL, and died in Calhoun Co., AR.

Mrs. Ethel Phillips, PO Box 1382, Morehead City, NC 28557-1382, believes she may be descended from Capt. THOMAS GRAVES of VA. She said that years ago on a research trip up the eastern shore of Virginia to Maryland and Delaware she found an archive narrative that stated Robert (Spencer) Burton's wife was Catharine Cotton, a daughter of Rev. William Cotton and wife Ann Graves. She would like proof of whether this connection is correct.

Her descent from Capt. Thomas Graves (if this connection is correct) is: (1) Capt. Thomas Graves, (2) Ann Graves m(1) Rev. William Cotton, (3) Catharine Cotton, b.c. 1641, Northampton Co., Virginia Colony, died before 1708, 6 children, m. Robert (Spencer) Burton. He was b.c. 1647 in England, died 1725 in Sussex Co., Delaware. He was an indentured man, Robert Spencer, who later

changed his name legally by court record to Robert Burton which he said was based on information from England that it was his correct surname. He migrated to Accomac Co., Virginia Colony by 1665. He m(2) Mrs. Comfort Leatherbury (nee Bagwell) (widow of Perry Leatherbury) between 1707 and 1717.

(4) Mary Burton, died before 1724 in Sussex Co., Delaware, married William Waples. He was born 7 Feb. 1676 in Nassawadox (Eastern Shore), Virginia (now Northampton Co.), was a planter, and operated a ferry for man and beast across the Indian River at Warwick, Delaware.

(5) Elizabeth Waples, died after 24 May 1766, m. Thomas Cary. He owned a tract of land called "Vineyard" and a water mill, and died before 22 July 1767 when his will of 24 May 1766 was probated in Sussex Co., Delaware.

(6) Samuel Cary, b. 4 April 1750 in Indian River Hundred, Sussex Co., Delaware, m. Comfort Waples on 12 Feb. 1770 at "Sawmill" Presbyterian church. She was b.c. 1749 in Indian River Hundred.

(7) Patience Cary, b. 16 June 1771, m(2) Isaiah Clifton/Clift on 24 May 1799. He was b.c. 1773 in the vicinity of the boundary of Kent Co., DE and Dorchester Co., MD.

(8) Charles Cary Clift, b. 20 Aug. 1805 in Indian River Hundred, Sussex Co., DE, m. Ann (Pool) Burton, about 1825-6 in Sussex Co., DE. She was a widow, born about 1800.

(9) Charles Wesley Clift, b. 22 Feb. 1835 in Belmont Co., OH, m. Elizabeth Miller on 19 April 1860. (10) Samuel Burton Clift, b. 4 Feb. 1864 in Belmont Co., OH, m. Matilda Kochert on 30 Aug. 1883. (11) Lewis Oscar Clift, b. 2 Feb. 1884 in Monroe Co., OH, m. Elizabeth Jane McLarty on 20 Jan. 1909.

(12) Ethel Matilda Clift m. Edmund Gorham Phillips.

(ED. NOTE: In the draft of the Capt. Thomas Graves genealogy, Catharine Cotton is not mentioned as a child of Ann and

William. Both this draft and Adventurers of Purse and Person only mention Verlinda Cotton as a child. It is certainly possible, however, based on dates, that Catharine could have been a child. Does anyone have evidence to indicate that is the case? Below is some of the information about Ann Graves in the genealogy.)

Ann (or Anne) Graves (5) was born about 1620, and died 2 March 1683/4 in Charles Co., Md. Her will was proved 18 July 1683 in Charles Co., Md. She first married Rev. William Cotton, son of Andrew Cotton and Joane -----, before 10 July 1637 in Hungar's Parish, Accawmack (or Accomac) Co., Va. He died in 1640. There is a tradition in the family that he was a son of widow Joan Cotton of Bunbury, Cheshire Co., England, and was granted 350 acres of land on the main branches of Hungar's Creek, adjoining the lands of his brother-in-law, Capt. William Stone. This consisted of 100 acres for personal adventure of himself and wife and 250 acres for the transportation of five persons to Virginia, viz. Eleanor Hill, Richard Hill, Edward Eason, and Domingo and Sambo, negroes. William Cotton was succeeded by Rev. John Rozier.

Ann secondly married Nathaniel Eaton, son of Richard Eaton, about 1641 (by 1642). Nathaniel was assistant to Rev. Rozier, and was previously the first head of Harvard College. He went to Virginia after his dismissal from Harvard. He fled from his creditors in Virginia about 1647, deserting his family, and died in 1674.

Ann thirdly married Francis Doughty, son of Francis Doughtie, on 8 June 1657. He died about 1683. He, like Ann's first two husbands, was Rector of Hungar's Parish. She later went with him to Rappahannock Co., where he was Rector of Sittenbourne and South Farnham Parishes in 1665.

Which children are by which of George's marriages, when were they born, and who are their descendants? An ancestor chart for Mrs. Thorn is on the next page.

Susannah (or Susanna) Graves (573) may have been born about 1777. She married George Morris on 7 April 1795 in Orange Co., VA. He was born 29 March 1763 and died 15 May 1853. He served in the Revolutionary War from Virginia.

The children of George were the following, but it is not presently known which ones were by his first wife (possibly Sally Biggers) and which by Susannah (except for Richard and Tandy, who were definitely by Susannah): Dabney, Richard G., Polly m. ----- Musgrove, Sarah m. Wright Bibb, Susan, Ann, and Tandy Graves.
