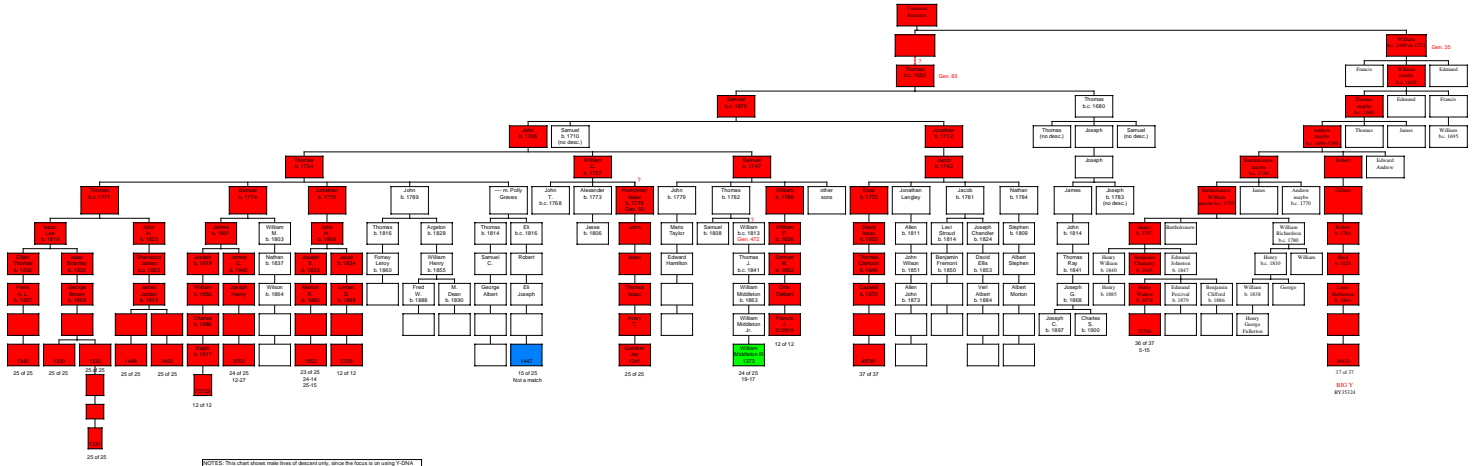


Connections for Graves Family of Drogheda, Co. Louth, Ireland (Gen. 35) and Thomas Graves of New Castle Co., DE (Gen. 85)
 (Rev. 6 April 2020)



NOTES: This chart shows each level of descent only, with the focus on using Y-DNA analysis to trace the Graves surname. The number in each box is the number of DNA test results. Other test takers of a common ancestor have exactly the same DNA test results, as assumed for the purposes of this chart, and are shown as in parentheses. The number in parentheses has been given the same color as the name color for the same DNA test results. Of all 25 males in each of the 25 males reached the same ancestral haplotype. A mutation in the 1-10 indicates a mutation from the ancestral haplotype, and marks marker 10 with a value of 10.

To streamline testing strategies and to make connections to other parts of the family, including the earlier ancestry, it is important for more descendants to participate in the DNA study and for those who have already taken part to upgrade their tests to 37 markers.

Based on present knowledge, it is possible that Thomas Graves of New Castle Co., DE, was a descendant of William Graves of Drogheda, but it is probably more likely that they have both descended from an earlier ancestor, as shown on this chart.
